# **Class News**

On Wednesday, Robins had a wonderful visit to Magdalen Farm. One of our activities was a hands-on farming experience where we fed the animals. We had a wonderful time. On Thursday, we made apple crumble using apples donated from a local orchard at Lower Westwater Farm. I hope the children enjoyed eating them. As part of our RE learning, we visited the church for a treasure hunt, looking for parts of the church for example the font, the altar and the Easter candle. As well as this we went to the church and role played a Baptism for our class doll, Frances Rosie Robin.

This week in Woodpecker class the year 1 children have been thinking about the ways that they can help our planet. Mrs Bray has posted a video of the children's work on our website, so please have a look. We hope you have a lovely half term and that the children who are going, enjoy the disco on Friday.

Show + tell for the first week back after half term will be, Lewis, Eva and Gabriel.

A huge well done to Owl class for having such a fantastic first half term. We have been busy finishing off each unit of work this week. The children have shown how much knowledge they have gained and are able to talk about. In science the children loved learning about the human skeleton and the organs in the body. In history the children have been able to compare the Mesolithic and Neolithic eras of the Stone Age. Last week we went on our trip to Offwell Woods where the children engaged in a range of teamwork-based activities to help Little Red Riding Hood help find Grandma. It was enjoyed by all

Kestrels have had a fantastic first half term and their learning behaviours have really improved. They have just finished their own stories based on 'King of the birds'. We have also finished our classifying organisms unit in science and the children wrote letters explaining why it is important to look after the biodiversity in the world. In computing they edited their own images to create a new image by merging two or more images. In RE we looked at the theological virtues and reflected on when we can see these in our lives. They also had a fantastic session at Colyton Grammar school where they learnt the skills involved in basketball and had the opportunity to play games.

Eagle class had a fantastic trip to We are the Curious (the science museum) in Bristol. They took part in a workshop where they used levers, cams and gears in practical activities to understand how they work. In the museum they 'played' with lots of the exhibits, learning about topics from honey to sand, our bodies to the earth, bubbles to animating. In class we have finished our writing topic and used our computing and art skills to present their work so it looked like a page from the book.
