In Robins this week, most of their work has been around the coronation. In their English they looked at a photo of King Charles III and thought of questions they could ask him. They also wrote him a letter sending him their best wishes for the coronation. The highlight of their week has to be their coronation party with preschool on Thursday afternoon. Before the party, they made crowns to wear and sandwiches to eat. Together they sang songs, listened to a story and enjoyed eating their food together.

This week Woodpeckers have been enjoying learning about different types of trees in science and planting their own pea plants. They have also enjoyed planning their stories which they are looking forward to writing next week.

Owls have shown great resilience in the start of this busier time of year. The children have started writing some amazing descriptive sentences about dragons in their English unit. In Geography, the children have thought about why Neil Armstrong may have wanted to go to the moon. In art, the children were able to explore using different textures that they may choose to use in their forest collage.

This week kestrel class have explored texture in their art lessons. They have experimented with using fabric as well as paper in a collage. In PSHE they have been discussing medicines and vaccines. They learnt that medicine bottles have labels which tell us how much medicine they can take and how often they can take it. They learnt about the importance of vaccines and found out about how vaccines were able to eliminate smallpox worldwide.
