Class News

In Robin Class this week, we have been enjoying learning about the Lunar New Year. In Drawing Club this week, we listened to the story of Nian the monster and enjoyed drawing and writing about Nian the monster, where he lived in the mountains and how we might be able to tame the monster. We also watched a video about celebrating the Lunar New Year and listened to a non- fiction book about Chinese New Year. In explore and learn some of the children chose to make lanterns and dancing dragons. We all made lion masks and learnt a lion dance. We also listened to the story, The Magic Paintbrush by Julia Donaldson and we learnt how to paint some characters in Mandarin. What a fabulous week!

This week in Woodpecker class the children have been skipping! It has been so lovely seeing them all out at break and lunch with their skipping ropes - what a great skill! We have been learning facts about Stegosaurus as part of our writing topic. The final piece will be children writing about an animal of their choice.

Show + Tell: Eva, Ryley and Sophie for show + tell on Thursday February the 6th.

Owls have shown great resilience over the last 2 weeks. They are enjoying the learning for each unit. In art, the children loved getting a messy with clay and creating amazing characters based on different poems. In science, they have explored the process of fossilisation. The children have come to the end of their English writing, where they have rewritten a classic tale, changing the characters into a range of animals, we can't wait to share these with you. Just a reminder that we will be going down to the library on Tuesday morning. Please could you ensure your child is in school by 8:45am, and that they have their library card and any unreturned books.

Over the last 2 weeks in Kestrels, we have all finished our own versions of 'Witty the waterdrop'. A particularly interesting story was when Witty ended up in a hot tub! We have now started our new book, which is a quest story, we have lots of ideas for our own stories already. In computing we are all creating podcasts using audio editing software. In science we have been looking at changing states of matter. In RE we have been looking at the corporal acts of mercy.

In Eagles, we have finished writing our stories based on the book Flotsam. They were very creative with each person imagining different pictures that were found on the camera. In History we are continuing our topic on WW2 and learnt about Operation Pied Piper (Evacuation) and the Blitz. In RE we have learnt about the Corporal Acts of Mercy and how they can be applied in everyday life.
