Task 1:-

Look at the front cover of the book, predict what you think the story is going to be about. Write 2 or 3 sentences.

Read chapter one or ask an adult to read it to you. Draw a picture of what you think Ruskin looks like, label the picture with words and phrases from chapter one.

Draw a picture of Lizard street, label the picture with words and phrases from chapter one.

Task 2

Read chapter 2.

How is Ruskin similar to his mum and dad? Write 2 -3 sentences to explain.

What do you think about Wendy? Use evidence from the chapter to explain your answer, write a short paragraph.

Do you agree with Wendy that Ruskin shouldn't play the part of the hero in the play? Explain your answer – write 2 or 3 sentences.

Predict – how do you think the football got onto the table?

Task 3

Read chapter 3

How are Wendy and Winston feeling? How do you know? Find and copy words and phrases from the text to explain your answer. HINT there are lots of these!

Find and copy the phrase that describes the football on the table – why do you think this is a good description? Draw a picture of what it looked like to explain your answer.

What is your opinion of Elvis? Would you like to be friends with Elvis? Explain your answer. Write a short paragraph.

Task 4

Read chapter 4 and 5

At the beginning of chapter 4 is Ruskin afraid of Elvis? Explain your answer – write 2 or 3 sentences.

Does this change by the end of chapter 4? Give reasons for your answer.

What have you now found out about Winston? Write down 3 or 4 facts that you now know.

Why do you think Winston lost his job at the zoo? Write a short paragraph telling the story. Use your imagination!

Task 5

Read chapter 6

Draw a picture of Dr Flowers, label the picture with words and phrases from this chapter.

What important fact have we found out in this chapter?

Research – in a later chapter the author talks about a famous person called Shakespeare, can you find out about him.

1. What did Shakespeare do that was so special?
2. When did he live?
3. What is a bard?
